
British hymn writer Fred Pratt Green wrote the text "When in our music God is glorified," in which one stanza speaks to us today:

The Grand Tour (Traveling with Hauptwerk) will be presented by Dr. Devon Howard, Director of Keyboard and Theory Studies and Music Department Chair at Southwestern Adventist University in Keene, Texas. ## AGO EXAM CERTIFICATION



## PEGGY GRAFF, FWAGO EXAM CERTIFICATION COORDINATOR

We are currently in the 2020-2021 exam cycle and are pleased to announce that FWAGO has been actively involved with the AGO Certification process. This past May, our chapter had four candidates who passed either a level of certification or a section of an exam. A workshop was offered in late August for Section 2 of the Colleague (CAGO) exam; and on November 13, five candidates will take Section 2 of the Colleague (CAGO) exam.

Three of our members plan to take Section 2 of the Associate (AAGO) exam and one member plans to take Section 2 of the Choirmaster (ChM) exam in June, 2021. They are studying for their perspective written exams and are getting together

regularly (safe distancing) to prepare for the various parts of the exams.

While many members of our chapter have gone through the challenge of the exam certification process, they have lived to tell about it. The process is challenging and takes extra time out of your busy life, but the dividends are immeasurable when your knowledge and keyboard skills are further cultivated and advanced. Certification may or may not give you prestige or a bigger paycheck, but what it does for you personally and professionally is invaluable.

If AGO Certification is on your bucket list, now is the time to consider going for it. Please know that you are not alone. Workshops and individual help is available; and if you ever need to talk through the process with someone who has experienced it (including me), please know that we are here for you.

Reasons people resist the exam certification process and reasons to encourage you to do it!

#### "I am too old for this."

No you're not, because we have chapter members who are over 80 who have challenged themselves by taking an exam!

## "I just don't have the time for this."

Yes you do, because if you begin today or tomorrow practicing some basic keyboard skills such as sight reading and transposition and spend 15 minutes a day at it, you will improve. Just take a hymn or an easy piece a day and sight-read it slowly at about 60 BPM; then transpose a phrase of it up a half step, down a half step, and up and down a whole step - just the melody, then the soprano/alto, then the other parts. Be patient with yourself, but discipline yourself. Just 15 minutes a day.

## "What if I make a fool out of myself?"

You can't make a fool out of yourself because you are challenging yourself to develop your skills – and you have the support of others who have gone through this who care about you and your success.

Go to <a href="www.agohq">www.agohq</a> to find out more about exam certification. Click on Education, then Certification. There are links to every level of certification you can read about; and after doing a little research, you might find that you have already played some of the organ repertoire listed at the various levels. You may also be proficient at some of the keyboard skills, but you want to develop others.

Another way to work toward certification is the new **AGO Achievement Awards**, a way for any level organist of any age to improve their skills with the help of their AGO chapter. The **AGO Achievement Awards** are a great way to learn basic organ playing skills, to fill in your existing skillset, to start on the road to AGO Certification, to structure organ teaching, and to get involved in your AGO chapter. Two of the awards listed below – Transposition and Harmony I – are especially worth looking into, as they are questions on each certification exam level.

**Current Achievement Awards:** 

- The Organ Console
- Organ Registration I
- Manual and Pedal Technique
- Transposition
- Harmony I

Choose an Achievement Award that interests you and then contact me, Peggy Graff. I will then appoint a qualified mentor who will volunteer their time and energy to help you throughout the process. You will prepare a single-page list of requirements on your own or with the help of the mentor, a teacher, a chapter member, or friend. The requirements can be completed at any time during one or more appointments with the mentor, who keeps track as each item is completed. After all requirements are met, you are recognized and presented with the certificate during a chapter event. ## TREASURER'S FINANCIAL REPORT

The budget for FY20 (1 July 2019 - 30 June 2020) had a projected planned deficit of \$5,465.00. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and cancellation of planned chapter events, the chapter ended the fiscal year on 30 June 2020 with a net gain of \$483.38. The financial report due to IRS was filed in August ahead of the November  $15^{th}$  deadline.

The budget approved by the Executive Committee for FY21 (1 July 2020 – 30 June 2021) projects \$9,937.00 in revenue and \$8,220.00 in expenses, with a projected net gain of \$1,717.00

Net worth on 1 July 2020 was \$79,050.19 (all cash assets).

## **CURRENT MEMBERSHIP STATISTICS**

As of September 14, 2020, the chapter membership statistics are:

- 4 Chapter Friends (no monthly magazine, voting privileges or discounts on AGO offerings)
- 23 Dual Members (21 from Dallas Chapter, 1 each from Charlotte Chapter and Cleveland Chapter)
- 51 Regular Members
- 56 Special Members (disabled or over 65)
- 13 Young Organist Members (under age 30)

## 147 Total members

27% (40 members) of chapter membership hold AGO certifications (including one member that has an AAGO equivalent certification earned from the Royal College of Organists in London).

56% (83 members) of chapter membership recorded in their membership record that they hold a job with a music employer.

35% of the membership live in Fort Worth. One member each resides in Australia, Connecticut and Oklahoma. The remaining members live in other cities north, east and west of Fort Worth.

Fort Worth AGO Chapter's long-time loyal chapter member, Marthe' Frances Kerlin, died suddenly and unexpectedly August 19, 2020. Fran, as most of us called her, was continually active in the chapter, having served on various committees, was elected Dean of the chapter for the 1967-1969 term, and was Coordinator & Program Director for a Southwest AGO Regional Convention. Fran was always wearing a big smile to accompany her sparkling personality. Some may remember her as Miss Marthe' Frances Brown before her marriage to Elliot Kerlin. Fran died peacefully at her home in west Fort Worth.
