AGO CERTIFICATION

PEGGY GRAFF, CERTIFICATION COORDINATOR

We are off to a good start with six candidates who are in the process of preparing for Service Playing Certification (SPC) and Colleague (CAGO) certification. Workshops were held in August and September at both levels for the 2021-2022 certification cycle.

If you did not attend a workshop but are interested to apply for a level of certification, please read the information below pertaining to your desired level with regard to examination dates, application deadlines, and fees. Go online to agohq.org – click on “education” – scroll down to “certification” – click your desired level of certification, and you will find a red button that says “apply.” Click on that button and you will be able to apply electronically for your level.

Please let me know how I can be of help to you as you consider the AGO Certification process!

EXAMINATION DATES, APPLICATION DEADLINES, AND FEES

SERVICE PLAYING CERTIFICATE TEST: October 1, 2021, through March 31, 2022.

SPC APPLICATION DEADLINES AND FEES:

Contact AGO Headquarters for application after July 1, 2021. The completed application may be submitted between September 1, 2021 and February 1, 2022.

FEE: \$175; STUDENT RATE: \$150

COLLEAGUE EXAMINATION: November 12, 2021, May 13, 2022, November 18, 2022.

CAGO APPLICATION DEADLINES AND FEES:

For the **November 2021** exam, contact AGO Headquarters for application form after July 1, 2021; application must be completed and submitted by September 15, 2021.

For the **May 2022** exam, contact Headquarters for application form after December 1, 2021; application must be completed and submitted by March 1, 2022.

For the **November 2022** exam, contact Headquarters for application form after July 1, 2022; application must be completed and submitted by September 15, 2022.

FEES: Both sections \$175, single section \$150. STUDENT RATE: Both sections \$150, single section \$125.

CHOIR MASTER EXAMINATION: June 1, 2022 (morning and afternoon).

AHREUM HAN CONGDON

Ahreum opened the Organ Fest on its first evening by playing “Mouvement,” by Jean Berveiller, and “Te Deum,” Op. 11, Jeanne Demessieux. She played the pieces on the five manual Garland organ at First Presbyterian Church, Fort Worth.

Ahreum’s exciting, powerful, and extraordinary performances have thrilled audiences far and wide. She was a featured soloist at the National Convention of the American Guild of Organists held in Nashville, at several Regional Conventions of the AGO (Cedar Rapids, New Haven, Atlanta, Sarasota); the Kimmel Center’s Verizon Hall (Philadelphia); Riverside Church, St. Thomas Church, Cathedral of St. John the Divine, St. Bartholomew’s Church, and Trinity Church, (NYC); Princeton University Chapel; Memorial Chapel at Harvard University; Ocean Grove Auditorium (NJ), Merrill Auditorium (ME), the International Organ Festival in Arbon, Switzerland, Michaelskirche (Leipzig, Germany), Oxford Town Hall (UK), Nottingham Albert Concert Hall (UK), and Esplanade Hall in Singapore.

She has received top prizes from numerous competitions, including the Oundle Award, the MTNA National Young Artist Performance Competition, the John Rodland Memorial Scholarship Competition, and the Albert Schweitzer organ competition. She graduated from Westminster Choir College (BM), Curtis Institute of Music (diploma), Yale Institute of Sacred Music (MM), University of Iowa (DMA). Her teachers include Ken Cowan, Alan Morrison, Thomas Murray, and Brett Wolgast. Congdon currently serves as the Director of Music and Organist at First Presbyterian Church of Fort Worth. She was previously a member of the organ faculty at Iowa State University in Ames, and was the College Organist at Cornell College in Mount Vernon, Iowa. She has served as an organist at Marquand Chapel and the Berkeley Divinity School of Yale University.

DAVID PRESTON, CAGO



David was one of the “rising stars” on the program as winner of the AGO/Quimby Southwest Region AGO/Quimby Regional Competition for Young Organists. The Organ Fest featured the winners from each AGO region. David played his selection on the Ross King organ at the Robert Carr Chapel on the campus of Texas Christian University. He played “Toccatina in C,” BWV 564:I, Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750).

The Tulsa AGO Chapter is hosting David as a recital organist at their October 1, 2021, event held at St. John’s Episcopal Church in Tulsa.

David is a church music major at Texas Christian University, where he studies organ with H. Joseph Butler. He was awarded the Nordan Young Artist Scholarship to attend TCU in 2018 and was awarded the first prize and hymn-playing excellence prize at the William B. Hall Pipe Organ Competition in San Antonio in 2019. David has played in numerous chapter recitals in both the Fort Worth and Dallas chapters of the AGO and earned Colleague certification from the AGO in 2016. He is presently director of music and organist at Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church in Haslet, Texas.

NEW MUSIC PUBLICATIONS BY CHAPTER MEMBER RYAN JAWAD

Ryan B. Jawad, organist at St. Peter Orthodox Church in south Fort Worth, has had several compositions and edited works published by *Deus in omnibus* in 2020. They are available on-line from Amazon and Barnes and Noble.

Ryan studied at the Peabody Institute and the Johns Hopkins University. He has a B. A. in Mathematics from Johns Hopkins and is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He became interested in medieval music when working at St. Peter’s, a western rite orthodox church. His current musical interests are in thematic stretching and in non-standard meters, specifically those that contain lopsided or irregular beats.



Below is a list of the recently published works:

The Abelard Hymnal. This is Ryan’s largest work; compiled after extensive research. In this collection, he has edited a set of medieval Christian songs obtained from 11th – 15th century manuscripts from 50 archives in 8 countries. Useful by church choirs familiar with Gregorian chant, the songs apply across the liturgical year. Hardbound; 589 pages. The July 2021 issue of *The American Organist* featured an article on the book.

Kiyo, organist at First United Methodist Church in Wichita Falls, Texas, and his wife, Chiemi, organist and music director at Floral Heights United Methodist Church in Wichita Falls, are long-time members of the Fort Worth AGO Chapter. They are relocating to Japan in December. Kiyo and Chiemi are featured on our chapter's October 17, 2021, "Dynamic Duos" organ concert. We wish Kiyo and Chiemi a safe journey to Japan, and we wish them continued success in their music careers.

The following article is quoted from *First Word*, August 31, 2021, newsletter of First United Methodist Church (FUMC), Wichita Falls.

Dr. Kiyo Watanabe has announced his decision to retire from his role as FUMC organist effective November 30, 2021. Kiyo's retirement this year is due in part to family concerns, especially the care of his mother in Japan.

Kiyo joined the FUMC staff in November 1996 and has developed a reputation for his work ethic and high standards of excellence. During his tenure at FUMC, Kiyo participated in the complete renovation of the organ, helped established the Elizabeth Prothro Organ Concert series, and assisted Mrs. Prothro on the FUMC history book, "Building Our Legacy." In addition, Kiyo has blessed FUMC with original compositions for the organ, handbells, and the choir. Kiyo also directed the Asbury Ringers, who performed in worship and at special concerts.

Reflecting on Kiyo's ministry at FUMC, Senior Minister Rev. John McLarty said, "I had the privilege of being on staff at FUMC when Kiyo was first hired. I was amazed at his energy as well as his talent. We played softball together in those early years and he was just as fast around the bases as he was moving from one task to another in the church! Kiyo doesn't play softball anymore, but he still moves just as quickly. I have enjoyed serving on the staff with him again. I never had to wonder if Kiyo was doing his job. I could always hear him rehearsing as I sat in my office. Our church and our community have been blessed for the past 25 years to have such a talented couple in our midst in Kiyo and Chiemi."

Kiyo's last Sunday at FUMC will be November 28. Plans will begin soon for a celebration of Kiyo's ministry. In addition, the Staff-Parish Relations Committee and the Leadership Board will work with Rev. McLarty and Music Director Kristen Gossett to put a plan together for the transition.

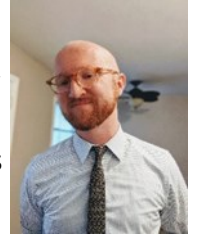

YEAR OF THE YOUNG ORGANIST

The Year of the Young Organist (July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022) is a project initiated by the national headquarters of the AGO. The project includes several initiatives on the national level: free one-year membership for any member enrolled or enrolls as a Young Organist member and various free workshops designed to help foster their careers.

On the local level, the chapter provided free food/beverage tickets to all our chapter's Young Organists who attended our FY22 season's opening event, September 10, 2021, at St. Andrew's Anglican Church in downtown Fort Worth. It was a great time for chapter members to meet and greet our Young Organists. Members were encouraged to take time to get to know them, offer them a tour of the organs they play, offer them opportunities to play a prelude, voluntary or postlude at one of the services of the churches they serve, give them music scores no longer used but believe will be a good addition to Young Organists' libraries, and make themselves available as an adviser to answer questions or give guidance that will be helpful in building their careers.

Chapter member Ed Ackermann has an on-going project to provide home electronic organs as practice instruments for Young Organists who do not already have an organ at home. Over the past 5 years, he has arranged to provide free organs for 8 members. The organs came from churches (organ music no longer used in their services or the churches closed) and from members no longer needing a practice instrument at home.

Our chapter webmaster, Andy Rose (a Young Organist) will soon post on our chapter website a listing of our Young Organist members, with photos and short biographies. The listing will also be emailed to all chapter members.
