From Peggy Graff, Sub-Dean and Program Director

Thank you for your continued support of our chapter and its events. Please consider attending the following event which will conclude the 2021-2022 season!

The 2021-2022 FW-AGO season is winding down, but there is one more exciting event planned! On Friday, May 6 at 7:00 pm, we will hear organist Peter Conte perform a recital on the 150-rank, 5-manual Dan Garland pipe organ at First United Methodist Church – Fort Worth. Weather-permitting, there

will be a reception at no cost to all who attend held in the beautiful garden area outside the sanctuary. The renovation of Wesley Hall will not be completed by this date, so we hope for a beautiful evening in the Garden! Hope to see you May 6!

Peter Richard Conte is an organist whose nearly-unparalleled technical facility, brilliant ear for lush tonal color, and innovative programming style have made him one of the most sought-after "orchestral" organists of this era. In 1989, he was appointed Wanamaker Grand Court Organist at what is now the Macy's Department Store in downtown Philadelphia—the fourth person to hold that title since the organ first played in 1911. He performs a majority of twice daily recitals, six days each week, on the largest (29,000 pipes) fully-functioning musical instrument in the world. Mr. Conte is also Principal Organist of Longwood Gardens, Kennett Square, PA, Organist/Choirmaster of St. Clement's Church, Philadelphia, a frequent collaborator and soloist with the Philadelphia Orchestra, and guest artist for the Philly Pops annual Christmas Spectacular.



Mr. Conte is highly regarded as a skillful performer and arranger of organ transcriptions. He has been regularly featured on National Public Radio, and on ABC television's "Good Morning America", and "World News Tonight." For 13 years he was heard on "The Wanamaker Organ Hour" radio show, broadcast via the internet at WRTI.ORG. He has been a featured artist at several American Guild of Organists' national and regional conventions, and has performed as soloist with orchestras around the country.

Peter Richard Conte has served as Adjunct Assistant Professor of Organ at Westminster Choir College, Princeton, NJ, where he taught Organ Improvisation. He is the 2008 recipient of the Distinguished Alumni Award from the Indiana University School of Music, Bloomington. In 2013, the Philadelphia Music Alliance honored him with a bronze plaque on the Avenue of the Arts' Walk of Fame. His numerous recordings appear on the Gothic, JAV, Pro Organo, Dorian, Raven, and DTR labels. His most recent solo CD, *Virgil Fox Remembered*, was released in May 2016 on the Raven label.

Certification has been the backbone of the AGO since its inception. Studying for and taking the guild exams is a way to challenge yourself, improve your organist skills, and it can also perhaps remind you that you know more than you think you know!

SPC: Saturday, August 20 | 9:00 am - 12:00 pm | 1:00 - 4:00 pm (attend both morning and afternoon sessions)

CAGO: Saturday, August 27 | **SECTION 1:** 10:00 am - 12:00 pm | **SECTION 2:** 1:00 - 4:00 pm (attend the workshop for whichever section you plan to take, or you can attend both sessions)

Have you been out of college for a while, or have you been a church organist for a long time and need to brush up on your skills?

The certification process can do this for you.

Yes, it takes extra effort, but the dividends are great!



CHAPTER ELECTIONS

It is chapter election year again. Elections are governed by the chapter's official *Operating Procedures* which have been approved by the chapter's voting members. The Chapter Secretary is charged with managing the elections.

Executive Committee Election: Every even numbered year our chapter has an election of Executive Committee members. The committee forms the governing board of the chapter. The committee is comprised of a Dean, Sub-Dean, Secretary, Treasurer, and six Directors (members at large representing chapter members). The six Director positions are grouped into two classes with each class serving four-year terms on a rotating basis so not all six positions become vacant at the same time. All of the positions are unsalaried volunteer incumbents.

Terms expiring midnight, June 30, 2022. Elected terms of the current Dean, Sub-Dean, Secretary, Treasurer and three of the six Director positions expire at midnight on June 30, 2022.

Non-elected Chapter Staff Positions: The Executive Committee appoints all other staff positions. Appointments have no term limits, but incumbents serve at the pleasure of the current Executive Committee and may be cancelled at any time. Chairs of the Courtesy, Finance, Membership, Placement & Substitutes, Professional Development, and Program Subcommittees all are appointed staff positions. The Executive Committee also appoints a Chaplain, Historian, Certification Exam Coordinator, and ONCARD Chapter Administrator. Other staff positions are members of those subcommittees. Subcommittee membership appointments currently include Email Administrator, Chapter Photographer, Community Arts Calendar Coordinator, Deputy Treasurer, Editor, Webmaster, Placement & Substitute Administrator, Scholarship Administrator, and Social Media Administrator.

Ad Hoc Nominating Committee: In accordance to our chapter's *Operating Procedures*, by December 31, preceding the election year, the Executive Committee appointed an *ad hoc* Nominating Committee with Jerry Aultman, FAGO, as chair and members Janet Pummill, CAGO, and Arlene Small. The Executive Committee tasked the Nominating Committee to develop a slate of Executive Committee *Officer* nominees for FY23 (July 1, 2022—June 30, 2023) and FY24 (July 1, 2023—June 20, 2024) and a slate of *Director* nominees for FY23, FY24, FY25 and FY26 (July 1, 2022—June 30, 2026) and was asked to report a nomination slate at the February 1, 2022 meeting of the Executive Committee. The reported slate follows.

Nomination Slate: To fill Officer Vacancies:

Dean: **Peggy Graff, CAGO** (Regular Member). She is currently Sub-Dean.

Sub-Dean: **Dr. Devon Howard** (Regular Member). He is currently a Director whose term expires on June 30th.

Secretary: **Ken Surley, CAGO** (Regular Member). He is the current Secretary and is permitted to run for another term.

Treasurer: **Elizabeth Kutz, CAGO** (Special Member). She is the current Treasurer and is permitted to run for another term.

To fill three Director Vacancies:

Andy Rose (Young Organist member). He was appointed to an elected Director's position that was vacated prior to term ending June 30th.

Aaron Walton, SPC (Young Organist member)

Fang-Lan Hseih, SPC (Special Member)

You may add nominees to the slate. Submit by email or postal mail the name of your nominee. Attach the names of five chapter voting members with their signatures to show their endorsement of your nominee. Pedals, Pipes, and Pizza




Many thanks to event coordinator Past Dean **Rebecca Sawyer** and to the FW AGO chapter volunteers who led an excellent Pedals, Pipes, and Pizza event on Saturday, January 15, at Arborlawn UMC in Fort Worth.

The program began with an introduction to the pipe organ with **Dan Garland** teaching about the pipes and **Jerry Westenkuehler** playing pieces to demonstrate their timbre. Many FW AGO member volunteered to facilitate the sessions including **Alissa Davis. Josh Lang, Larry McCain, Janet Pummill, Jordan Smith, Amy Stewart, Ken Surley**, and **Echo Wilson.** Past Dean **Kyla Rosenberger** provided flyers about the Will Hayes Scholarship Fund and applications for attendees.

Nineteen students and two piano teachers were introduced to pedal technique and given a taste of hymn playing. They were instructed in the difference between playing the organ (wind instrument) and piano the (percussion instrument). They were given a partial tour of the chamber. allotted time for registration assistance on the Garland organ, and given the chance to perform in an informal concert. All participants wore masks, sanitized, and were served pizza in a non-contact way.
