NOTE-WORTHY NEWS! PEGGY GRAFF, CERTIFICATION EXAM COORDINATOR

Happy Summer, Colleagues!

As the summer season approaches, I hope this finds you having a more relaxed schedule! As you look ahead and think of goals for the coming season, think "AGO CERTIFICATION!" Our chapter has a significant percentage of organists who have attained certification at the SPC level and levels beyond. If you are among those certified organists, consider the next level of certification! If you have not yet challenged yourself to go through the certification process and take an exam, now is the time to do so! AGO certification has been the backbone of the AGO since its inception. Studying for and taking the guild exams is a way to challenge yourself and to improve your organist skills; and by doing so, reminding yourself that you know more than you think you know!

The July issue of *The American Organist* will give information on the 2022-2023 exam cycle for all levels of certification, including how to obtain an application, application and payment deadline, organ repertoire choices, and other exam requirements. **Local certification workshops** will be held later this summer at FUMC-FW for Service Playing Certification (SPC) and Colleague (CAGO) exam, **based on the interest of chapter members. You must contact FWAGO Certification Coordinator**, **Peggy Graff**, (pgraff@myfumc.org) by July 20 this summer if you are wanting to attend a workshop to prepare for SPC or CAGO certification.

Proposed workshop dates are:

SPC: Saturday, August 20 | 9:00 am - 12:00 pm | 1:00 - 4:00 pm (attend both morning and afternoon sessions)

CAGO: Saturday, August 27 | **SECTION 1:** 10:00 am - 12:00 pm | **SECTION 2:** 1:00 - 4:00 pm (attend the workshop for whichever section of the exam you plan to take, or you can attend both sessions)

NOTE: If you plan to prepare for the AAGO, ChM, or FAGO exams in the 2022-2023 exam cycle, please contact me **as soon as possible**. I plan to get experts on various parts of those exams to conduct study sessions, and I need some lead time to do this so that exam candidates can be offered adequate preparation.

Have you been out of college for a while, or have you been a church organist for a long time and need to brush up on your skills?
The certification process can do this for you!
Yes, it takes extra effort, but the dividends are great!

Hayes Memorial Scholarship**. **Thatcher Nelson** attended our recent chapter Pipes, Pedals and Pizza event and subsequently applied for our scholarship. Meet FW AGO Chapter's Young Organist, STEPHEN KUCERA, CAGO

Stephen Kucera (pronounced *KOOCH-ur-uh*) is one of Fort Worth AGO Chapter's newest Young Organist members, age 28. He lives in Euless. He has a CAGO organist certification, BS degree, BA degree (organ major), master's in accountancy, is a CPA, and a figure skater. He is skilled as a theater and church organist.

Stephen's weekday career involves data metrics analytics for TPG, a private equity company TPG's office in Fort Worth. As much as possible, he reserves weekends to serve as a church organist and to judge figure skating events. He travels about 50% of the time, so while he can't take on a regular Sunday church organist position; when not traveling, he is available to substitute as an organist. He is our newest addition to the chapter's official substitute roster.

Stephen has played eight years for three Presbyterian churches, and a year for an Episcopalian church and a Baptist church. He has substituted in almost all denominations, both Protestant and Catholic. He has experience playing in ensembles/groups, accompanying choirs, and a working experience of liturgy. His strength is sight reading and supporting the choir and congregation singing.

Stephen started piano around age 5 and organ at age 13. At age 18 (in 2012), he was a theater organ competition finalist at the ATOS (American Theater Organ Society) national convention in Los Angeles. One of his competition pieces was the "Flight of the Bumblebee."

Our chapter has reached a new historic high for number of members! Membership has risen steadily since 2018 when membership hovered in the low 120s. We now have 166!

- 20 Young Organist Members (under 30)

Seven of the Dual Members are Young Members in their primary chapters (4 in Dallas, 2 in Central Arizona, and 1 in Boston), so we have 39 Young Organist Members! That's almost ¼ of the chapter!

Our Dual Members all have Dallas as their primary chapter, except 1 in Austin, 1 in Boston, 1 in Cleveland, and 1 in Oklahoma City.
