## SATURDAY, MARCH 20 AT 10 AM - SUBSTITUTING: PEARLS OR PERILS

Join us for this informative and interesting workshop featuring **Dr. Beverly Howard**, FWAGO Dean, and **Ed Ackerman**, CAGO. This workshop will be presented via zoom – it is NOT an in-person workshop. The zoom link will be emailed to you by Ed Ackermann prior to March 20.

- How to adapt quickly to a church, service format, and an organ that is new to you
- Evaluating your performance after each sub job; feedback to the resident organist
- Weddings and funerals

It is a pleasure to announce the second Young Organist scholarship award by the Fort Worth AGO. **Peter Gresser**, a 16-year-old homeschooler from Weatherford, will receive \$900 for his first year of organ study. He studies accordion and piano with Elena Fainshtein and will be studying the organ with our member, **Dr. Devon Howard**. Peter has won state-wide awards on the accordion, played piano regularly at his church, and completed a college theory course with Dr. Howard.

The Scholarship Committee of Barbara Marquart, Alissa Brewer and Kyla Rosenberger approved Peter's application and audition recordings. Ed Ackermann, our ever-industrious member, obtained a used Allen home practice organ (originally owned by members Mary Jo Springer, Joe Breedlove and Andy Rose) and supervised its delivery to the Gresser's house. The Executive Committee seconded the scholarship award and the purchase of a pedal extension device for loan to our new Organ Scholar and future young organists as needed. 
A reception was held at the King residence on March 6, 2021. A memorial service will be planned, scheduled and announced in late Spring of this year.
